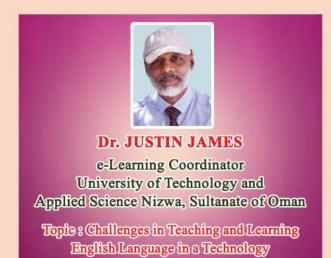

The PG and Research Department of English is one of the star departments of the college. B.A. English was introduced in 1967, and M.A. English was introduced in 1970. It has periodically revised and updated the B.A., M.A. and M.Phil. syllabi, incorporating socially relevant and job-oriented papers. Task-based English Language Teaching was introduced in 1998 for Part II General English, and since then, the department is actively engaged in Text Book and Supplementary Materials writing. A review seminar on Task-based English Teaching was held in February 2017 to mark the 25th anniversary of materials production. A seminar titled *Interrogating the Self: the Postcolonial Prerogative* was also organized to mark the golden jubilee year of the department.
